It was **RESOLVED** that the Minutes of the Town Council meeting held on Mon 16th June 2025 and the Minutes of the Open Spaces meeting held on Monday 30th June 25 (both circulated with the agenda) were approved as a true and correct record and were signed by the Chair.

Matters arising – Garden Competition - in answer to Cllr Mincher's question, Deputy Clerk reported that there were 6 garden entries and 7 scarecrows. The exceptionally dry hot summer had deterred several people from entering.

PC Recchia had confirmed by email that there were no incidents linked to the Village public house. There was one report in relation to an Air Rifle which was an isolated incident and concerns are not to be raised in relation to this.

Cllrs questioned what the 9 Other Road related offences were and felt 10 Violence reports including 5 Public Order was high.

5. TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE FROM COUNCILLOR KEVIN FOSTER ON COUNTY MATTERS

- Mayor of York & North Yorks and NYC plan for improvements for the A6136 this consists of rephasing the traffic lights particularly at The Broadway to stop the side roads tripping too quickly and causing queuing. A briefing note to NYC of 17th Aug 2023 was circulated. This concerned Highway Mitigation arising from development along the A6136 and it stated any mitigation work would have to be funded through developer contributions.
- Local Plan Consultation now closed. This was the largest piece of work currently being done which would finish in 2027 before the next elections. Once in place, all development will follow the Plan. Cllr Foster noticed DIO sites not being used for re-development.
- Boundary Commission Update will be published in September.
- Community Governance Review at full council last week. CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) will be the main funding method after 2027 when the Local Plan comes into use and will supersede 106 contributions. Parish Councils with a Neighbourhood Place will receive a higher % from CIL with a basis 5% for parishes without a NP. Government have recently cut funding that helped parish and town councils create those plans.
- **Developer's consultation event for the Old Recreation Field off A6136** adjacent to Colburn Grange Farm Tues 15th July, St Cuthberts Church, Colburn. Cllr Mincher represented Colburn Town Council. 38 residents attended the event. The main issue was the road access for 100 additional homes with the A6136 at capacity. A planning application would be submitted later in the year.
- **Area Committee meeting** Tues 15th Sept at County Hall, Northallerton. The MP will attend to answer questions.
- Police, Fire & Crime Panel meeting Wed 8th Oct at York Council offices. Parking issues on Easton/Fosse Way were mentioned. Long standing problems with lorries overnight, condition of roads but the business park is privately owned, not part of the Highways network.

Cllr Dale offered to lead a Working Group to initiate firstly a Town Plan as currently the Council had no plan for evacuations or resident support for any weather or unforeseen crisis. From this working document, it was hoped to create a framework to develop a Neighbourhood Plan engaging with the public.

It was agreed that a Working Group consisting on Cllrs Dale, Tutora, Towers, Hildyard and Willetts would meet on Monday 28th July at 5.30 pm in the Village Hall to start proceedings. All councillors were invited to attend, confirmation email to be sent out by office.

7. TO RECEIVE REPORTS FROM OTHER BODIES INCLUDING COLBURN COMMUNITY SPORTS CENTRE AND TO INCLUDE CURRENT PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Community Sports Centre (CCSC)

Status report up to 10th July 2025 had been circulated and filed on the computer.



MUGA upgrade (Playzone) planning application submitted having liaised with neighbours regarding issues such as noise, lighting, flood effects. Colburn Youth Project has begun new Friday evening sessions. Air Yoga class is running two sessions per week.

Extended hours on a weekend are proving more popular than initial period. Darville Dancing School is proving to be very busy on a Saturday morning.

Saturday morning Boot Camp has had soft launch. Second Trustee has taken a coaching/instructor course through the centre.

Richmondshire Pro Player have applied to the Football Foundation for the off-grid catering unit as Trustees felt it was a good addition if managed properly.

Extra membership cards ordered and pushing of app to members. Boxing Club running extra sessions for junior members. Tiny Titans will be taking a school holiday break from end of July.

RPP & CCSC are looking at the viability of having a full-size football pitch on top of the current junior pitches. Hopefully Planning application goes through smoothly and the work can start asap.
